**Note:** Calculation of the grade point average (GPA) for graduation honors shall be identical to that method used to calculate the current GPA (as of <u>April 30, 2020</u>) to fulfill graduation requirements for the degree, diploma, or certificate being earned.

In order to be eligible for a graduation honor, the student must have completed a minimum of 32 semester credit hours at the college conferring the degree.
