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Emergency Medical Technician Program (EMT-Basic)

The Emergency Medical Technician Basic (EMT-B) program is designed to prepare individuals to provide basic health care assistance at the scene of the illness or traumatic injury. EMT classes are offered day and evening hours. The Basic Level can be completed in one semester. The faculty is committed to providing academic and clinical learning experiences that will enable the student to develop the necessary knowledge, attitudes, and skills required of the EMT. Many graduates are employed by the Birmingham area Fire, Rescue and Ambulance Services. Some graduates use the knowledge and skills they obtain to prepare them to serve their communities in Volunteer Fire and Rescue Services. Program graduates are awarded a short certificate and are eligible for consideration to take the National Registry of EMT Basic Examination which is used by the State of Alabama Department of Public Health to grant an EMT-Basic license. The program is approved by the Alabama Department of Postsecondary Education and the Alabama Department of Public Health. Pending accreditation from the Alabama Department of Public Health (OEMS)

Admission Criteria:

1. Meet all institutional requirements
2. Meet the Essential Functions or Technical Standards required for EMS.
3. Receipt of completed application for the EMT-Basic Program.

Emergency Medical Technician Advanced Program
(AEMT)

The Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) is designed to prepare individuals desiring to expand their career in Emergency Medical Services with the ability to initiate intravenous therapy and limited pharmacology. This course qualifies students completing this program to work or volunteer as an Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) for a fire department, ambulance services or in private industry. Students successfully completing the AEMT courses will be eligible for consideration to take the National Registry of EMT's Examination, which is used by the State of Alabama Department of Public Health to grant EMT licensure pending accreditation from the OEMS.

Admission Criteria:

1. Meet all institutional requirements
2. Meet the Essential Functions or Technical Standards required for AEMS.
3. Receipt of completed application for the EMT-Advanced Program.
4. Licensed EMT-Basic
