# **SUBJECTS AND COURSES**

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - CRIMINAL JUSTICE CRJ 220 (CRJ)

### **CRJ 100** Intro to Criminal Justice

This course surveys the entire criminal justice process from law enforcement to the administration of justice through corrections. It discusses the history and philosophy of the system and introduces 3 Credit Hours various career opportunities.

#### **CRI 110 Intro to Law Enforcement**

This course examines the history and philosophy of law enforcement, as well as the organization and jurisdiction of local, state, and federal agencies. It includes the duties and functions of law enforcement officers. **3 Credit Hours** 

### **Police Patrol CRI 116**

This course studies the duties, and responsibilities of the uniformed police patrol. It emphasizes the importance of patrol function and includes principles, methods, procedures and resources used in police patrol operations. (as needed) 3 Credit Hours

### **CRI 130** Intro to Law and Jud Process

This course provides an introduction to the basic elements of substantive and procedural law and the stages in the judicial process. It includes an overview of state and federal court structure. 3 Credit Hours

#### **CRJ 140 Criminal Law & Procedure**

This course examines both substantive and procedural law. The legal elements of various crimes are discussed, with emphasis placed on the contents of the Alabama Code. Areas of criminal procedure essential to the criminal justice profession are covered. 3 Credit Hours

### **Introduction to Corrections**

This course provides an introduction to the philosophical and historical foundations of corrections in America. Incarceration and some of its alternatives are considered. 3 Credit Hours

### **Criminal and Deviant Behavior CRJ 177**

This course analyzes criminal and deviant behavior systems. An emphasis is placed on sociological and psychological theories of crime causation. 3 Credit Hours

### **Introduction to Criminology** CRI 208

This course delves into the nature and extent of crime in the United States as well as criminal delinquent behavior and theories of causation. The study includes criminal personalities, principles of prevention, control and treatment. 3 Credit Hours

### Juvenile Delinguency

This course examines the causes of delinquency. It also reviews programs of prevention and control of juvenile delinquency as well as the role of the courts. **3 Credit Hours** 

### **CRJ 212 Correctional Counseling Tech**

CODE - C PREREQUISITE: As required by program. This course focuses on the basic concepts of influencing human behavior. Theories of individual and group counseling are emphasized, as well as some of the barriers faced in dealing with the public offender. **3 Credit Hours** 

### **CRJ 216 Police Organization and Adm**

This course examines the principles of organization and administration of law enforcement agencies. Theories of management, budgeting, and various personnel issues are covered. 3 Credit Hours

### **Criminal Investigation**

This course explores the theory and scope of criminal investigation. The duties and responsibilities of the investigator are included. The techniques and strategies used in investigation are emphasized.

### **3 Credit Hours**

#### **CRI 238 Crime Scene Investigation**

This course examines the fundamentals of crime scene investigation. Measuring and sketching the scene, photography, evidence collection and preservation, and courtroom procedures are considered.

### 3 Credit Hours

#### **CRI 256 Correctional Rehabilitation**

This course surveys the different methods used in the rehabilitation of public offenders. Topics include individual and group counseling, education, recreation, religion, drug treatment, and vocational **3 Credit Hours** programs.

#### **CRI 280 Internship in Criminal Justice**

This course involves practical experience with a criminal justice agency under faculty supervision. Permission of the instructor is required. This course may be repeated with the approval of the department head.
